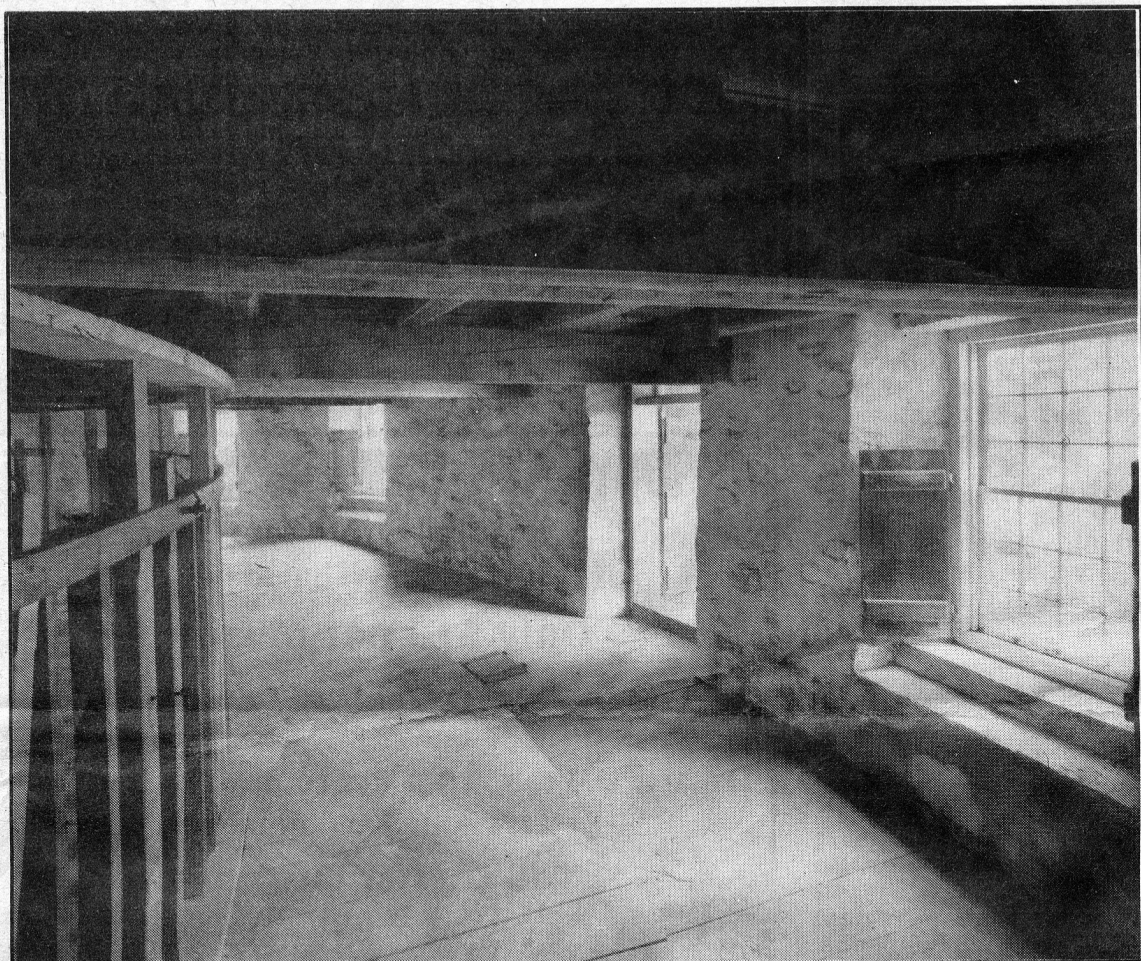

Large format photography exhibit coming to Rosewood

The Rosewood Arts Centre Gallery will present an exhibit featuring panoramic and large format photography by Richard Malogorski of Dayton and large format photography by David Bartlette of Morehead, Ky.

The exhibit runs from Aug. 26 through Sept. 26. There will be a public reception at the gallery from 2 to 4 p.m. on Sunday, Aug. 24. Both the exhibit and the reception are free and open to the public.

Malogorski will show recent black and white photography done with his 8x10 view camera and his Cirkut camera. The Cirkut camera is a panorama camera capable of recording a full 360 degrees, which, he says, "requires an inclusive approach, one that seems to escape reality by including more of it." Malogorski says he draws his inspiration from the masters, such as Alfred Stieglitz,

Paul Strand, Ansel Adams "and many more."

Bartlett, associate professor of art at Morehead State University, will also show large format, black and white photography. Bartlett has a master's degree in fine arts photography from the University of Michigan School and a master's degree in fine arts philosophy from Yale University.

Describing his work as expressing "a Romantic sensibility," Bartlett says "at the heart of the photographic experience is the phenomenon of noticing a spontaneous event of consciousness, an event of neither active nor passive reception, during which our sensory experience is illuminated."

Hours of the exhibit are Monday through Thursday, 8 a.m. to 9 p.m.; Friday, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; and Saturday, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. For more information, call 296-0294.
