Father-Son artists to exhibit at Fairmont Gallery

The Kettering City School District's Art Department will host an exhibit in the Fairmont High School Art Gallery that will feature the works of fatherand-son artists, Emerick Malogorski and Richard Malogorski. The Father-Son Art Exhibit will run from January 18 - February 24 and is open to the public.

The elder Malogorski, a life-long Kettering resident and a former teacher of watercolor painting at Rosewood Arts Center, is a painter of the representational manner. He is best known for landscapes and still-life paintings, using subjects that reflect the beauty of the outdoors and the reflection of light on landscape. Emerick, 91, studied at the Dayton Art Institute, as well as privately with John Pike, Elliot O'Hara, Carl Schmalz and William Gerhold. He has also studied art at the Cincinnati Academy of Art with Don Getz, and he is the recipient of a number of awards for his paintings, which continue to enjoy popularity at local and national art exhibits.

Richard, who now lives in Bath Township, is a film studies graduate of Wright State University and a professional photographer. He has had several one-man and selected-group exhibits in such locations as the Dayton Art Institute, Rosewood Arts Center, the Fort Wayne Museum of Art and the Columbus Cultural Arts Center. Collections of Richard's work can be found at Kettering Medical Center; the Teachers Insurance Corp in New York, Boston and Dallas; the U.S. Consulate in Hong Kong; and The Paris Commune Restaurant in New York City.

During the run of The Father-Son Art Exhibit, Richard will be presenting to the advanced art and photography students at Fairmont High School.
